What has Dick Moore done for Milford?

- He fought to include \$3.5 million to improve the timing and coordination of seven traffic signals along Route 16 on the Boston Region Metropolitan Planning Organization’s Transportation Infrastructure Project (TIP) list.
- He landed \$793,793 Community Development Block Grant for the use of housing rehabilitation for four units; Prospect Heights street, sidewalk, and drainage improvements.
- He battled side by side with local officials against the EPA to delay egregious stormwater treatment regulations that would require significant local investment.
- He called for the allocation of \$697,488 in Education Jobs Fund monies through the Chapter 70 formula to ensure children in Milford have adequate class sizes and qualified teachers.

While Dick Moore has worked tirelessly over the course of the 2009-2010 session, throughout his public service as a State Representative and as a member of the Senate, he has led the way to achieving real results on major efforts that have helped make Milford a beautiful place to live and work.

What else has Dick Moore done for Milford?

- He worked with leaders of Milford Regional Medical Center to break ground on the now complete and operational, state of the art Dana Farber cancer center.
- He worked with local leaders to advance and complete the Upper Charles Trail, which has become a recreational gem for the region.
- He secured the transfer of the Milford Armory back to the community for its current use as a youth center.
